Nagasaki University (NU) is a national comprehensive research university whose origin can date back to 1857 when a Dutch surgeon started medical training for young doctors in the Nagasaki Magistrate's Office. Located in a region that geographically faces the Eurasian Continent across the East China Sea, NU seeks to develop new values and educate human resources who can contribute to the sustainable development of the world and local communities.

NU has about 7,500 undergraduate and 1,500 graduate students with 10 faculties and 7 graduate schools on 3 campuses. The University offers unique education programs in such research disciplines as tropical medicine, infectious diseases, radiation health sciences, marine energy, marine biotic resources, and abolishment of nuclear weapons.

We have 252 MoUs and 177 student exchange agreements with partners worldwide. North-Western State Medical University named after I.I. Mechnikov in the Russian Federation is one of our important partners with which we have been collaborating with in the "Japan-Russia Intercollegiate Cooperative Project for Nurturing Leaders in Disaster and Radiation Health Sciences" funded by MEXT Japan since 2017.
