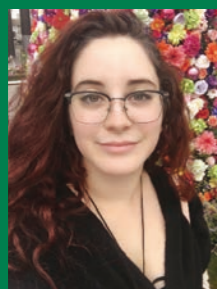
Exchange Student's Comment

新潟大学では学生の「グローバル対応力」を強化する取組を進めています。その一環として、外国語そのものを学ぶ授業科目以外に、英語や中国語などの外国語で、人文社会科学系、自然科学系の基礎的科目を約200科目開講しています。なぜこのような科目を開講しているのでしょうか。それぞれの国の人々はそれぞれの国の言葉で育ち、それぞれの国の人としてのアイデンティティを育みます。日本以外の国のこと、その国の人々のことを知るには、自分のアイデンティティとともにその国の人々のアイデンティティを知ることが大切です。もっと色々なことを学びたいと考える皆さんには、外国語で開講される授業を履修することによって留学生と共に自分自身の教養を高めたり、自分自身の専門科目を外国語で学ぶことによって自分のアイデンティティとともに日本以外の国の人々のアイデンティティを知り、国際的な視野を広げて戴きたいと思えます。その学習の効果を副専攻「外国語(英語)」の修了証書という形で卒業する時に得ることも可能です。また、1年生の時からこうした授業を履修することは、当然のことながら留学の準備としても有効ですし、留学生と共修することは日本にいながらにして留学のような経験をすることにもなります。そして是非自身で留学して真の国際人になることを期待します。自分自身の専門である主専攻プログラムに加えて、副専攻「外国語(英語)」の修了も視野に入れて、文系・理系を問わず英語“で”一緒に学んでみませんか。

日本語による授業科目と同様に、英語による授業科目も様々な分野、レベルにより開講されています。

本パンフレットで主に紹介しているのは、内容が入門的で、学部を問わず履修できる英語科目(左表A-1、B-1、C-1)です。各学部の高学年の学生のみを対象とした科目(A-2、B-2、C-2)については所属する学部で確認してください。1、2年生のうちにA-1を履修することは、3、4年生次にA-2を履修したり留学するための準備として有効です。



英語の授業を履修する意義・メリット

- 日本の文化、地理・歴史など、知識はあっても英語で説明できないことは少なくないと思いますが、「日本文化入門」などを履修することは、こうした英語を学ぶのに有効です。
- 自分が所属する学部が提供する英語による授業を1、2年生のうちに履修しておくことは、3、4年生になってから専門科目を英語で履修したり、留学する際に有効です。分野ごとに使われる専門用語が異なるため、一般的な英語ができるだけでは、アカデミックな内容である英語による授業を理解することは難しいためです。
- 多くの科目は留学生も履修しているため、留学せずとも外国人学生と一緒に学ぶことができます。
- このパンフレットに掲載されている科目は、すべて単位認定されます。計画的な履修により、副専攻「外国語(英語)」としての認定も可能です。

Don't speak Japanese? Don't worry!

If you are thinking about studying in Japan but are hesitant because you cannot speak Japanese, Niigata University should be your first choice!

As shown in the list of classes starting on page 6, Niigata University offers many classes taught in non-Japanese languages. In particular, we have increased the number of classes conducted in English over the last several years. Even if you cannot speak Japanese, you can study a wide range of subjects in liberal arts and in your areas of specialization.

As you will study together with Japanese students in most of these classes, you will be able to learn a lot through international interactions. Taking these classes as a starting point, you may join classes conducted in Japanese with Japanese students to broaden your horizons from a Japanese perspective.

Examples of Study/Research Conducted in English at Niigata University

Studying or doing research over a short period (up to a year) as a non-degree seeking student at Niigata University

Through a student exchange program (for students from universities that have a student exchange agreement with Niigata University):

- A semester or a full year
- Students mainly take courses offered in English as shown in the course model registration example on page 4.
- Students can also learn basic Japanese according to their language needs.

Students return to their home countries and obtain a bachelor's degree from their universities.

Course Registration Model of Niigata University's Program for Exchange Students

Niigata University's program for exchange students accepts undergraduate students for a semester or a full year from universities abroad that have signed a student exchange agreement with Niigata University. The program provides a range of courses for exchange students. The aim of this program is to impart diverse knowledge as well as understanding about Japan to the exchange students and to deepen cooperation with partner universities.

The tables below show an example of a class schedule. Based on your interest, you can also choose from other classes offered in English, which are listed starting on page 6. You will have opportunities to study with Japanese students in many of these classes.

Classes in introductory Japanese are also available in addition to classes offered in English or other non-Japanese languages.

英語等の外国語運用能力を身につけるプログラムに加えて、留学準備のための「国際教養」というプログラムもあります。



副専攻「国際教養」

留学に必要な知識を体系的に学ぶための副専攻です。この副専攻は、いわゆる「リベラルアーツ」を見直し、「新潟大学から留学する学生が留学により大きな意義を見出せるような「国際教養」並びに「日本に関する知識(ジャパノロジー)」を学ぶ機会と動機を与えること」を目的としています。留学を経験した教職員・学生は数多くいますが、そのほとんどが留学した際に「自分が日本のことを知らないこと」と「世界に様々な考え方やその土地での常識があること」に気付くという体験を持っています。これらは事前に学習することでそして事後に学び直すことで、非常に効果的にその知識と理解を深めることができ、そうしたことを学ぶ場を提供するのがこの副専攻です。

副専攻「外国語(英語)」

卒業までに準上級以上の英語運用能力を身に付けるためのプログラムです。英語“を”学ぶ科目だけではなく、このパンフレットに掲載している英語“で”学ぶ科目を順次対象科目に追加していきます。従来は英米文化などの人文科学系の科目を中心として学ぶプログラムでしたが、平成30年度からは社会科学系、自然科学系の内容の科目を中心とした履修でも修了が可能になります。

副専攻の認定証書取得を目指さなくても、履修計画にこれら副専攻の対象科目を組み入れることは、留学の準備、教養を身に付けること、英語力の向上に有効です。
