# Learning in Japanese Subjects

Target students: Economics, Law, Humanities, Education, Creative Studies.

#### Intensive Japanese Course

Special course provided for those who are sponsored by the government and have no previous Japanese Learning experience. And in Addition students must be in the degree seeking program.

- 1. All the lessons will be held ON-LINE synchronously. You need a Desktop PC, Tablet PC, Laptop PC, or Smartphone.
  - ⇒ Web camera and Microphone must be installed on your PC.
  - ⇒ Tablet or Smartphone users must have downloaded Zoom application before lessons.
     ½ Zoom will be used for the lessons.

- 3. Subject Registration must be done through Internet


Registration period for Japanese subjects: from September 17 to October 1
