(AUN-SUN/SixERS Cross-Cultural Event)  
Jointly organised by the AUN - SUN/SixERS**

**Concept Note**

**EVENT DESCRIPTION**

In 2013, AUN Secretariat had organised the kickoff “**AUN-SUN/SixERS Study and Visit Programme Discovery, Diversity, Dynamics (3Ds)**,” also known as the “Summer School”, for students from Okayama University. It has become the annual student mobility programme in partnership with 6 Japanese universities under the “SUN/SixERS” consortium.

Since the pandemic, we all have faced several challenges and issues in interacting and interconnecting with others domestically and internationally. The pandemic has directly affected the exchange of culture as it normally requires in-person interaction.

Even though the pandemic and social distancing are preventing students from meeting in person, our partnership believes that there is an opportunity to utilize the use of technology to continually provide new opportunities for students in our networks to exchange culture and knowledge and to establish good relations among the youths and young leaders from ASEAN and Japan. **The organisation of “ASEAN-Japan Virtual Cultural Exchange Programme 2022 (AUN-SUN/SixERS Cross-Cultural Event)”** proves that, despite the COVID-19 pandemic, the cultural exchange opportunity is still ongoing. Therefore, the programme is scheduled to be organised virtually during 1 - 3 March 2022 for students from ASEAN Member countries and Japan.

The three-day programme consists of several activities such as Cultural Dialogue, ASEAN Virtual Museum Tour, ASEAN Unseen Trip Activities etc. Each activity will provide an opportunity for participants to explore other cultures and exchange their culture among participants. At the same time, these activities will allow each participant to get to know each other and to learn to be in a multicultural atmosphere. Furthermore, the programme is also expected to be a platform for South-East Asia and East Asia students to create their networks for their future collaborations.

## **OBJECTIVES**

1. To build knowledge and understanding on ASEAN-Japan Identity, different cultures and languages in ASEAN and Japan.
2. To create competency for cross-cultural communication and to promote leadership skills among Southeast Asia and East Asia youth.
3. To provide participants platforms to materialise their ideas on the international stage while allowing participants to learn the necessary skills for future employment in a multicultural society.
4. To promote cultural engagement among Southeast Asia and Japan.
5. To promote awareness of sustainable development among youth.

## **EXPECTED OUTPUTS**

1. About 60 students attended from Japan and ASEAN
2. Two sessions of Cultural Dialogue by experts
3. Two sessions of Cultural Workshop
4. Three sessions of Cultural Exposure Activities

## **EXPECTED OUTCOMES**

The expected outcomes are evaluated by the “Individual Student Competency Assessment” on:

**Background information on the organisers**

**The consortium of six National University in Japan**—Chiba University, Niigata University, Kanazawa University, Okayama University, Nagasaki University, and Kumamoto University—has its aim to create a centre for world-class innovative research, develop highly trained graduates for leadership in a globalising world, contribute to local communities and promote international activities, through various forms of collaboration based on each university's respective strengths and traditions.

The partnership agreement between AUN and SUN/SixERS was officially established in April 2013 to explore the possibility of a collaborative framework on student mobility, student placement and internship. Exchanges with overseas partner universities, thus, are among SUN/SixERS' current initiatives and are keys to encouraging dynamic development and achieving the anticipated milestone.

The **ASEAN-Japan Virtual Cultural Exchange Programme 2022 (AUN-SUN/SixERS Cross-Cultural Event)** is jointly organised by the AUN Secretariat and the SUN/SixERS consortium. Previously, the on-site version of this event had been organised between 2013 to 2019. This virtual event is the first of its kind.
